AT \$689Z, THE FIRST FLIGHT OF TWO MIG'SWERE REFLECTED RECOVERING AT HANOI GIA LAM, WHILE A SECOND FLIGHT OF THREE MIG'S CONTINUED TO RECEIVE INFORMATIONON THE HOSTILE AIRCRAFT. AT \$619Z, THIS FLIGHT WAS ORDERED TO ATTACK THE HOSTILE AIRCRAFT WHEN THEY APPEARED. AT \$622Z, AN UNIDENTIFIED GROUND CONTROLLER ORDERED THE FLIGHT TO ATTACK AND THE FLIGHT LEADER ANSHERED EXCITEDLY THAT HE SAN THEM AND "I SHOT ALREADY".
